- 1. Ability to **stay on task** for extended time
- 2. Ability to work well independently
- 3. Ability to **follow directions from a teacher** or other adult

- 5. Ability to **follow written directions** on a page
- 6. Ability to **listen to others** well
- 7. **Maturity** for their age
- 8. Good **attention span** at school, home and otherwise

- 10. Being **self-motivated**
- 11. The **student actually wants to learn** and not being pushed into learning the instrument.
